## National e-Governance Division organizes a Capacity Building Programme under Digital India on 'Digital Transformation of the Organization & Economy'

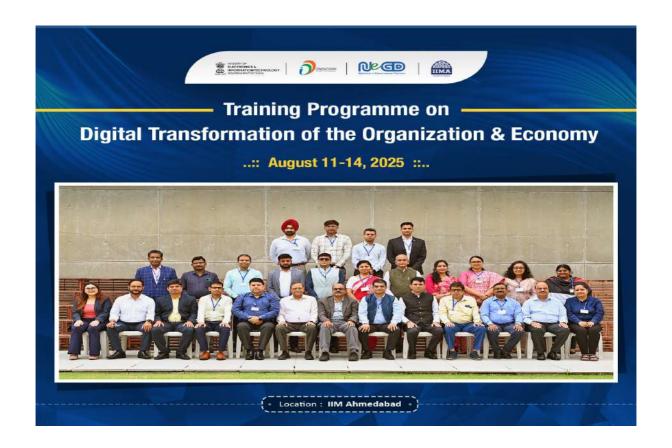

The curriculum is a blend of lectures, case studies, and hands-on activities to foster innovative thinking and practical application in sectors like health, governance, and beyond.

The Capacity-Building scheme under the Digital India Programme intends to build adequate and relevant capacities at all government levels and provide need-based training to conceptualize, lead, design, and implement e-Governance projects. Vigorous efforts have been made to reach a large number of government officials and train them in relevant skills.
