- **Digital India Talk Show organised at IIIT Naya Raipur to promote awareness about Digital India initiatives and citizen-centric digital services**

**Naya Raipur, Chhattisgarh, August 7, 2026:** The National e-Governance Division (NeGD), Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India, in collaboration with IIIT Naya Raipur, organised a **Digital India Talk Show (University Workshop)** at IIIT Naya Raipur, on August 7, 2026.

The workshop aimed at creating awareness among university students about key Digital India initiatives, Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI), citizen-centric digital services, cybersecurity and data protection, while encouraging greater engagement with digital platforms and services.
