- **Digital India Workshop Organised at the National Test House, Jaipur**
- **Workshop Highlights Citizen-Centric Digital Platforms, Cybersecurity and Digital Public Infrastructure**

Jaipur, July 23, 2026: As part of its efforts to promote digital awareness and citizen-centric governance, the National e-Governance Division (NeGD), Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India, in collaboration with the Department of Consumer Affairs, organised a Digital India Workshop at the premises of the National Test House (NTH), Jaipur, on July 23, 2026.

The workshop aimed at creating awareness about flagship Digital India initiatives and familiarise participants with citizen-centric digital platforms that are simplifying access to government services.

The programme commenced with a welcome address by Shri Ilayaraj Soundararajan, Scientist In-Charge, followed by opening remarks from Mr. Shiven Shankar, NeGD. Senior officials from the Department of Consumer Affairs, Jaipur, attended the workshop and encouraged participants to leverage Digital Public Infrastructure for improving public service delivery and digital governance.

The workshop featured technical sessions delivered by experts from NeGD. Mr. Shiven Shankar presented on DigiLocker and Entity Locker, demonstrating how the platforms enable secure, paperless document storage and verification. Mr. Nitish Kalra conducted a session on Cybersecurity and the Digital Personal Data Protection (DPDP) Act, 2023, highlighting the importance of responsible digital behaviour, data privacy and safe online practices.

Mr. Sachin Bhardwaj, NeGD, presented sessions on UMANG and myScheme, showcasing how citizens can access a wide range of government services and welfare schemes through unified digital platforms.

Ms. Aastha Gupta, NeGD, conducted sessions on API Setu, MeriPehchaan, and UX4G, explaining how these initiatives facilitate secure digital integration, streamlined user authentication and user-centric service design for government platforms.

The workshop witnessed active participation from officials and stakeholders, who engaged in interactive discussions with the experts on Digital Public Infrastructure, cybersecurity and citizen-centric digital governance.

The programme reaffirmed NeGD's commitment to building digital awareness and promoting the adoption of Digital India platforms through awareness initiatives across the country.
